A research reflection on why foundational questions still matter in the age of intelligent systems.

Scientific progress begins not only by finding better answers—but by asking better questions.

Artificial intelligence continues to advance at an extraordinary pace. New models, new capabilities, and new applications emerge almost continuously. Capabilities continue to improve. Benchmarks are repeatedly surpassed. Yet some of the most important questions remain surprisingly open. What makes an AI system trustworthy? What should governance mean once AI systems execute autonomously? Is explainability enough? Can execution itself become evidence? What is the relationship between intelligence, runtime, semantic state, and accountability?

These are not questions with immediate answers. Nor do they belong to any single discipline. They lie at the intersection of computer science, systems engineering, governance, philosophy, and the emerging architecture of intelligent systems.

Frontier Notes was created as a place to think about these questions. Not to announce finished theories. Not to promote products. Not to defend predetermined conclusions. Not to defend predetermined conclusions. But to make foundational questions easier to see. And to examine foundational problems that may become increasingly important as artificial intelligence continues to evolve. Each note explores one question. Sometimes the answer remains incomplete. Sometimes the question itself changes. We consider that part of scientific inquiry.

Many of the questions explored in these notes naturally connect to our ongoing research on runtime governance through the SSGE project. However, Frontier Notes is intentionally broader than any individual system or implementation. Its purpose is to explore architectural questions that may shape the future of trustworthy intelligent systems, regardless of how they are ultimately realized.

Artificial intelligence will continue to become more capable. Whether it also becomes more trustworthy remains an open question. We hope Frontier Notes can contribute, in a small way, to this ongoing conversation.
